Individuals with disabilities and their families, as well as healthcare professionals, school personnel, advocates, case managers, and others throughout New Mexico.

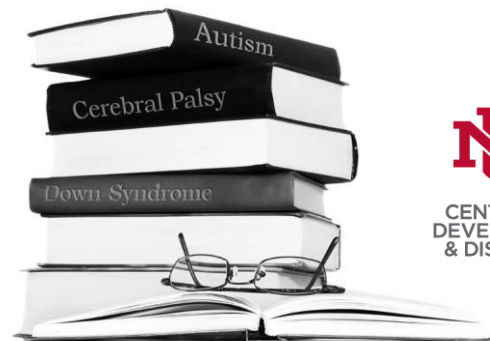


**The library features several specialized collections with books, DVDs, and eBooks available for check out. Collections include:**
